Overview and Objective

Welcome to American History I! It is my pleasure to have you in my class this semester. Please take some time to review the information in this syllabus. It is your responsibility to be aware of all classroom and school rules. This course is a survey of American history from the start of the Republic until present times. Upon completion, students should be able to analyze significant political, social, and cultural developments and themes in American history. This course is created in a way to develop skills such as active reading, basic writing, the use of primary and secondary evidence to support a position, and critical thinking.

Requirements and Expectations

- 1. Students will acquire information from a variety of sources, and will use that information for problem solving, decision making, and planning.
- 2. Students will come to class prepared! That means having your supplies **every** day.
- 3. Be in your seat when the bell rings and make sure your cell phones are put away.
- 4. Students will be required to do all assigned readings in order to be better prepared for classroom discussions.
- 5. All work must be handed in on the day it is due or suffer a late penalty. **Make Up Work**: It is YOUR responsibility as the STUDENT to obtain all information resulting from ANY absence. If you are absent for any reason, you will have 5 SCHOOL days from your return to make up any missing work that was assigned on the days that you were absent. After those 5 days, any work not made up will be entered as a ZERO. Students who are in jeopardy of failing due to absences and the failure to make up missed work will require a referral to the Student Support Team. The Student Support Team will work with students and their teachers on a plan for grade recovery.

 - Material "Performance/Evaluative" Work 60%

Student's demonstration of mastery of curriculum standards: tests, formal performances, final drafts.

• Either Material Practice or Performance: presentations, projects, quizzes, labs.
